

## SPAIN'S APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

On the occasion of his visit to CERN on 18 February 1982, the Spanish Minister of Industry and Energy, Mr. Ignacio Bayon Mariné, informed the Director-General, Professor Herwig Schopper, of Spain's decision to negotiate for readmission as a Member State of the Organization.

To this end, he sent to the Director-General a telex message on 24 February 1982, to be confirmed shortly by letter, for forwarding to the President of the Council.

The message is attached hereto as Annex I. Annex II sets out the legal and financial considerations pertaining to a State's membership of the Organization.
